Dr. Aileen Dillane is the Course Director of the MA in Irish Music Studies at the Irish World Academy of Music and Dance, University of Limerick, Ireland, where she teaches undergraduate and graduate classes in Irish traditional music studies, popular music, and ethnomusicology. Aileen received her PhD in Ethnomusicology from the University of Chicago where she was a Century Fellow and Fulbright scholar. While living in Chicago, Aileen was a member of the band Anish and played in numerous sessions around the city. In 2017, Aileen was the Herbert Allen & Donald R. Keough Visiting Faculty Fellow and the Moore & Livingston Faculty Fellow at the Keough-Naughton Institute for Irish Studies at the University of Notre Dame where she taught a course on Irish music in North America, performed, and led an Irish music ensemble. While at Notre Dame, Aileen spent time in special collections in the Hesburgh Library, which houses the library of Captain Francis O'Neill, researching O'Neill's work and legacy as part of her current book project on Irish music in Chicago. Aileen plays flute, tin whistle, and piano and is a member of the Templeglantine Ceilí Band (2010 All-Ireland winners).
